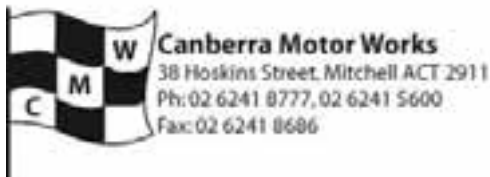

In the event of a tie for first or any other subsequent places the time taken in the second round for the three scores will be added together, the team with the fastest time will be placed in front of the teams with equal penalties. There will be no jump off against the clock.

Point Scoring for Australian Showjumping Championships

The Bates 2009 Australian Showjumping Championships will be determined as follows:

- **Australian Junior Champion:** Points will be allocated to 10th place (10 down to 1) in respect of results in **Classes 1 and 5(b)**.
- Points will be allocated on the same basis for **Class 8** but with a **50% loading added** (i.e. 15 points for 1st down to 2 points for 10th)
- **Australian Young Rider Champion:** Points will be allocated to 10th place (10 down to 1) in respect of results in **Classes 2 and 6(b)**.
- Points will be allocated on the same basis for **Class 9** but with a **50% loading added** (i.e. 15 points for 1st down to 2 points for 10th)
- **Australian Senior Champion:** Points will be allocated to 10th place (10 down to 1) in respect of results in **Classes 3 and 7(b)**.
- Points will be allocated on the same basis for **Class 10** but with a **50% loading added** (i.e. 15 points for 1st down to 2 points for 10th)

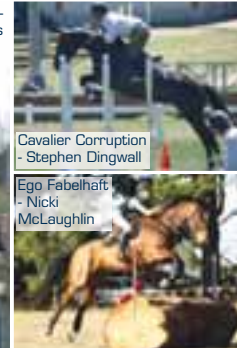

2. All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. Competitors, or in the case of minors, their parent or guardian, shall sign a waiver and indemnity form and agree to abide by all conditions of competition and the venue before being permitted to compete. ACT Showjumping Club Inc and the Equestrian Australia accept no responsibility for the loss of, or damage to any exhibit or other property.
3. All classes in Rings 1 and 2 will be run under FEI and EA Rules. Australian helmet standards will apply and ALL COMPETITORS MUST BE WEARING A PROPERLY SECURED HELMET AT ALL TIMES WHEN MOUNTED ANYWHERE WITHIN THE VENUE.
4. All competitors and owners of horses competing in all classes in Rings 1 and 2 must be current financial members of the EFA. Any competitor in Ring 3 who is not a member of the EA or the ACT Showjumping Club Inc will be required to complete and sign the EA issued waiver and pay a day membership of \$10 (\$20 for the event).
5. All horses nominated for any official class in Rings 1 and 2 must hold current registration and showjumping grading cards from the EFA. Grading shall be in accordance with the National Grading System.
6. Grading cards may be asked to be produced on the day and must be produced to obtain prize money.
7. ENTRIES FOR ALL RINGS AND CLASSES must be lodged on Global Entries Online and accompanied by full payment by close of entries on Friday, 26 September 2009. No phone entries will be accepted.
8. LATE ENTRIES, SUBSTITUTIONS AND UPGRADINGS will be accepted provided that they are submitted to the Entries Office between 4.00pm and 5.00pm on the day prior to the relevant class. Late entries must be accompanied by a fee which is double the required fee for pre-entry. Substitutions and upgradings, except for Championship Classes, will incur an administration fee of \$3.00 per entry. These surcharges will be strictly enforced.
9. REFUNDS - Full refunds, less a \$3.00 administration fee per entry, will be given up to 5.00pm on Thursday 8 October 2009. After that time 75% of the entry fee will be refunded if a veterinary or medical certificate is produced. No refund will be made for a missed class or a scratching that is not accompanied by a veterinary or medical certificate
10. Juniors - Riders competing in Rings 1 and 2 may take part in competitions and championships for Juniors from the beginning of the year of their 12th birthday to the end of the year of their 18th birthday. Juniors may compete in Junior, Young Rider and Senior classes, in which they are eligible, but not on the same horse, nor on a horse which has been or will be ridden by another rider in any class.
11. Young Riders - Riders competing in Rings 1 and 2 may take part in competitions and championships for Young Riders from the beginning of the year of their 16th birthday to the end of the year of their 21st birthday. Young Riders may compete in Young Rider and Senior classes, in which they are eligible, but not on the same horse, nor on a horse which has been or will be ridden by another rider in any class.
12. Juniors competing in Ring 3 may only enter junior classes. For the purposes of Ring 3 only, a Junior is a person who has not yet turned 18 years of age or who will turn 18 in 2009; i.e competitors under the age of 12 are included.
13. All riders will be expected to have read and accepted the conditions of entry, before being permitted to compete
14. **All horses entered in any Senior Championship class are required to be stabled from, at the latest, 10.00am on Friday, 9 October 2009 until completion of the final round of the Championship. Self constructed portable stables are acceptable. Ring 1 will be available to these horse for a 90 second warm-up between 2.00pm and 3.30 pm on Thursday, 8 October 2009. These times will be firmly adhered to by the Organisers.**
15. ACT Showjumping Club Inc reserves the right to randomly swab any horse and check equipment of any horse in any class.
16. Any horses not ready to jump when called may be eliminated.
17. DRESS – RINGS 1 and 2: Formal Dress Code as specified by the EA Showjumping Addendum will apply at all times, including walking the course, unless otherwise decided by the judge - RINGS 3: Summer Dress Code, with white or fawn breeches, will apply at all times, including walking the course.
18. All horses to be mounted for presentation and riders to be in correct attire.
19. PROTESTS must be addressed to the Ground Jury in writing, accompanied by a \$50.00 fee, within the following time limits –
 - Protests against the eligibility of a rider or horse, no later than 30 minutes before the start of the relevant class;
 - Protests against an obstacle or to the course, the length or plan of the course no later than 15 minutes before the start of the relevant class;
 - Protests concerning irregularities or incidents during a class, no later than 30 minutes after the announcement of the results of the relevant class
 - The period of jurisdiction of the Ground Jury extends from 1 hour before the start of a class until 30 minutes after the announcement of the final results of the class. The fee will be refunded if the protest is upheld.
20. All Competitors are responsible for picking up manure and other rubbish in the vicinity of their floats and trucks.
21. **NO DOGS WILL BE ALLOWED WITHIN THE FENCED AREA CONTAINING THE ARENAS. DOGS PRESENT ON ANY OTHER PART OF THE VENUE MUST BE RESTRAINED AT ALL TIMES.**

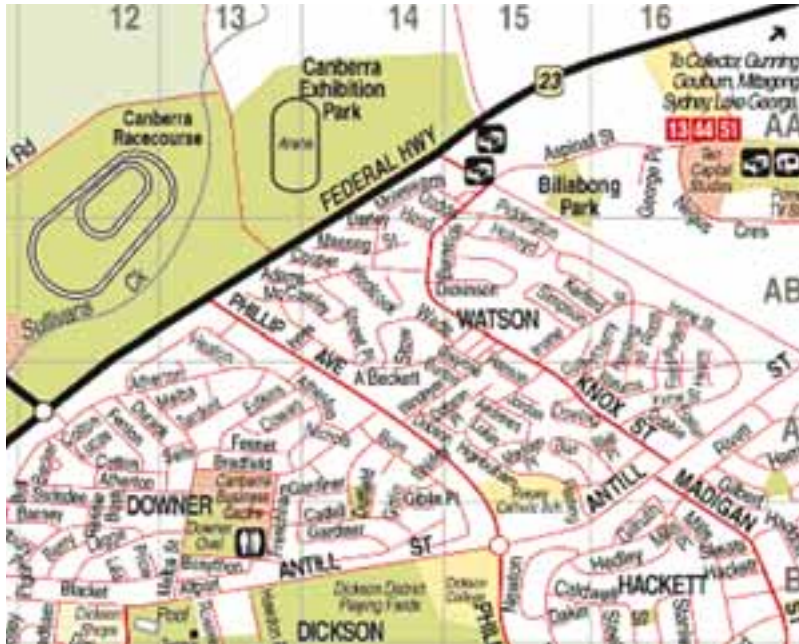

This will be the 47th running of the title which commenced at Deniliquin in the NSW Riverina when the winner was Kevin Bacon on Ocean Foam. Since then a competition has been held each year except 1981 throughout Australia and the names of the winning horses and riders are the Who's Who of the sport . John Fahey has won the title five times on five different horses, Guy Creighton on four occasions, all on different mounts. Kevin Bacon, Art Uytendaal, Gavin Chester three times each. Jeff Evans, Peter Mullins, Les Bunning, George Sanna, Chris Chugg, Vicki Roycroft and Rod Brown on two occasions each. The following is a list of past winners of the Championship and the venues involved. Chris Chugg, riding Vivant, won the Championships in 2007 and 2008.
